#### **COVID-19 Response**

We have come a long way since March and swift actions early on helped us protect the health and safety of Coloradans.



We went from 160 tests per day at the state lab to nearly 55,000 per day statewide.





PPE: we have enough swabs and PPE to conduct testing for the next calendar year.



Coloradans are wearing masks statewide, slowing the spread of the virus.




#### **COVID-19 Response**




#### Colorado: Total Number of COVID-19 Cases Reported Per Day






## Colorado: Total Estimated New Daily Infections & Infections Reported Through Testing/Contact Tracing





#### Number of Deaths Among COVID-19 Cases in Colorado by Date of Death






#### POLICY UPDATES: COVID-19 DIAL FRAMEWORK

The dial is a tool for counties to use to make life during the pandemic more sustainable, allowing us to balance, to the greatest extent possible, controlling the virus with our social and economic needs.

The epidemiology curves in Level Red counties demonstrate the success of the Level Red capacity limits






- > 35 counties in Level Red

#### Colorado's Dial Framework that determines County Level Restrictions


#### 7-Day Incidence per 100,000 (CEDRS, updated Jan 04, 2021)







#### Colorado's Goal is to Keep the R-Naught (Reproductive Number) Below 1






## Trends in Currently Hospitalized Patients and New Hospital Admissions

Our North star: To prevent a breach of hospital capacity and enter crisis standards of care




#### Colorado: Currently Hospitalized COVID-19 Patients, March - January 6






#### Hospital Capacity Tracking: Percentage of ICU Beds In Use, April - Jan 5

#### Highest-risk health care workers and individuals:

- People who have direct contact with COVID-19 patients for 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period.
- Long-term care facility staff and residents.

#### 1B

Coloradans age 70+, moderate-risk health care workers, first responders, frontline essential workers, and continuity of state government:

- Health care workers with less direct contact with COVID-19 patients (e.g. home health, hospice, pharmacy, dental, etc.) and EMS.
- Firefighters, police, COVID-19 response personnel, correctional workers, and funeral services.
- People age 70 and older.
- Frontline essential workers in education, food and agriculture, manufacturing, U.S. postal service, public transit and specialized transportation staff, grocery, public health, frontline essential human service workers, and direct care providers for Coloradans experiencing homelessness.
- Essential officials from executive, legislative and judicial branches of state government.






#### Phase 1 Timeline
